# Taiz Economic and Social Development Plan Taiz Governorate 2024-2026



## Introduction

The local authority in the governorate and its executive institutions aim to establish a sustainable partnership with all development partners. This is based on comprehensive and clear data, and it involves the development of a detailed assessment for the situation and needs of each field to implement this plan in order to achieve the development goals of the governorate, enhance partnerships, activate and mobilize the community, and strengthen its internal capabilities to serve the growth and development of the local community. This will enable the community to improve its developmental conditions in all sectors.

The economic and social development plan is one of the pillars of the local authority's capacity-building project, which has resulted in forming the needs in a clear and detailed analytical manner that will ultimately improve the performance of the local authority and enable it to provide services optimally. This plan has been updated based on the joint collaboration initiated in 2023 with the United Nations under the Economic framework document developed by the United Nations to support resilience-building programs and the transition from humanitarian assistance to sustainable development solutions to improve the livelihoods of Yemenis. The United Nations has adopted the principle of Area-Based programming, with programs being multi-sectoral within the economic framework and aligned with the priorities at governorate level. Taiz was selected as a pilot for carrying out this approach by the United Nations.

The preparatory efforts of the United Nations and the local authority in Taiz Governorate culminated in a joint workshop held in June 2023 in Taiz Governorate, attended by approximately 70 participants from the local authority led by the governor of Taiz, various United Nations agencies, representatives of donors, private sector representatives, and civil society in Taiz.

The presentations made at the workshop and the discussions highlighted that the rapid population growth rate and high fertility rates have had significant effects on basic social and environmental services and employment opportunities. Population indicators for the governorate show an annual population growth rate of approximately 2.5%, which requires a focus on supporting and enhancing government policies aimed at balancing economic and social resources with population increases.

Data and reports also indicate a continuous increase in the poverty rate, with the rate rising from 35% in 2005 to 42% in 2006, then reaching 49% in 2014 and estimated at 80% in 2022, all as a percentage of the total population. The unemployment rate in the province was approximately 29% in 2011 for the age group (15-65), rising to 48% in 2014. Some research and studies indicate that this rate has increased to 57% in 2022 due to the ongoing crisis, and the circumstances in Taiz have led to the destruction of the governorate's infrastructure, with all economic indicators in all sectors being negative.

Due to the scarcity of financial resources resulting from the war and the siege, the focus in the discussions of priorities for normalizing life and economic recovery in the governorate was on key sectors. This included improving basic services for citizens, resource development, and capacity building by relying on local resources, support from central government (despite its scarcity), and external funding from international organizations. Additionally, economic recovery is critically reliant on the active participation of the private sector and civil society organizations.

After reviewing the drafts of the documents prepared by the local authority and by the United Nations team regarding the priorities to be focused on in the coming period, the workshop discussions resulted in an agreement on a framework for programs at the governorate level distributed across four pillars:

1. **Governance and public administration** based on evidence-based planning, sound public financial management, and effective coordination among stakeholders in the field of international aid.
2. **Security and peace** as fundamental factors enabling economic and social development and strengthening the social contract.
3. **Comprehensive and integrated basic and social services** that respond to the multifaceted nature of community needs.
4. **Realizing the economic potential of Taiz province.**

## Planning Methodology:

Based on the agreed-upon pillars outlined above, this programmatic plan has been prepared through collaboration between the MOPIC Team and a team from relevant local authority offices, in addition to the participation of representatives from the private sector, civil society organizations according to the following stages:

**First Stage: Planning and Needs Assessment.**

**Second Stage: Organizing a series of meetings with members of the technical committee and relevant stakeholders:**

- Formation of the team responsible for preparing the plan (Annex 2 contains the names of main committee members, technical committee members, and copies of committee formation decisions).
- Team training.
- Preparation of the general framework for the plan (models, tools, data collection, etc.).
- Preparation of templates and assignment of team tasks for data collection.
- Data collection, compilation, and analysis, categorizing it according to the model.
- Determining overall priorities.
- Identifying the most pressing needs and priority projects according to each core priority.
- Preparation and drafting of the initial draft.
- Review by relevant stakeholders and the supervisory committee.
- Incorporating feedback and final plan review.
- Presenting the plan and preparing it for approval by the relevant authorities, following the project structure.

**Third Stage: Resource Mobilization and Partnership Building.**

**Fourth Stage: Monitoring and Evaluation of Implementation Progress.**

## The Purpose of the Plan:

To create a common ground between the local authority and active parties, supporters, and stakeholders in economic and social development in Taiz Governorate. It assists in understanding the situation, services, and infrastructure in the governorate, as well as the social and economic implications of the crisis and its repercussions. Furthermore, it helps in identifying urgent needs in all relevant sectors.

## Guiding Principles and Assumptions for Plan Development:

- Availability of funding sources, including:
  - Local resources.
  - Central support.
  - Donor organizations and civil society organizations.
- Availability of economic opportunities.
- Collaboration and dialogues with all stakeholders (government sector, private sector, civil society organizations, donors, UN agencies, and international organizations).
- Hierarchical identification of needs from the grassroots to the top.
- Prioritization based on the four identified core pillars.

## Time Frame and Geographic Coverage:

The economic and social development plan covers the period from 2024 to 2026. The plan is subject to quarterly, semi-annual, and annual reviews, following the monitoring mechanism established in the Economic Transformation Workshop. This mechanism allows for the incorporation of changes in the economic and political landscape, especially in the event of reaching a comprehensive and sustainable peace.

The plan encompasses 17 liberated districts, including Al-Mukha, Mawza, Al-Wazi'iyah, Thoubab, Al-Mudhaffar, Al-Qahirah, Salah, Al-Shamaytin, Al-Mawasit, Al-Ma'afir, Jabal Habshi, Al-Misraakh, Mashra'a Wa Hudnan, Sabir Al-Mawadem, Al-Selw, Maqbanah, and Sama'e.

## Pillar 1: Governance and Public Administration:

The local authority in Taiz Governorate believes that enhancing good governance and effective public administration are the fundamental prerequisites for economic recovery, restoring essential service systems, resource generation and development, and rebuilding government institutions and facilities affected by the war. These institutions should play their role in serving the citizens. Therefore, the primary goal under this pillar is:

**Activating a system of good governance and effective administration that responds to citizens' needs and supports political and economic stability.**

### 1.1 Priorities

1. Achieving clear arrangements between local authorities and the central government for empowering local authorities to exercise all necessary powers to achieve the desired development in the governorate.
2. Building institutional and human capacities within local authority bodies in the field of public financial management, including budget preparation and execution, oversight, resource management, rationalizing expenditures, and effectively engaging the community in this aspect.
3. Building institutional and human capacities within local authority bodies in the field of evidence-based planning and data-driven decision-making.
4. Activating tools of supervision, accountability, anti-corruption mechanisms, and citizen participation.

## 2. The second pillar: Peace and Security

Achieving societal stability and extending security control over all liberated areas is the true gateway to stability and creating a favorable and attractive environment for private sector investments and the interventions of international and local organizations, leading to economic recovery. The stability of liberated areas will result in the return of displaced people, the repatriation of migrant capital, and the entry of development organizations. All of this will have a positive impact on improving the living conditions of the people and the stability of government institutions in their operations, especially in revenue generation. Therefore, the main objective of this pillar is:

**To enhance security and societal stability, prepare for a sustainable peace phase, preserve social cohesion and support reconciliation initiatives.**

### 2.1 Priority Areas

1. Enhancing local peacebuilding, reconciliation, and local mediation efforts, especially concerning the restoration of essential services and expanding the scope of these efforts at the district level.
2. Strengthening the presence and performance of police departments, including the female police and security agencies in all liberated districts.
3. Improving access to justice and protection services.
4. The safe opening of roads, including mine clearance and assistance to mine victims.

## The Fourth Pillar: Realizing the Economic Potential of Taiz Governorate

Creating job opportunities and attracting investment to Taiz is the fundamental pillar for stabilizing the society, breaking free from economic stagnation, and gradually achieving economic recovery in line with the changing realities. The human capital in Taiz and the private sector of Taiz which recognizes the importance of economic growth are among the key strong factors in Taiz that can be relied upon. The main goal of this pillar is:

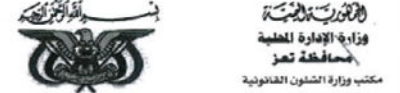
